*Sparkling reflections: Highlights from
Colonial Williamsburg's glass collection*

7pm BST, Thursday 21 May 2026

The Colonial Williamsburg museum in Virginia, USA, has a collection of British, European, and American glass spanning the 17th to the mid-19th centuries. Objects reflect documentary records and archaeological finds of early America: rare green glass roemers matching shards at Jamestown, and blue glass mugs and decanters relate to fragments found in Williamsburg. Angelika Kuettner will share these and other highlights from Colonial Williamsburg's collection.

Angelika Kuettner has been at the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation since 2008, Curator of Ceramics and Glass from 2024. She co-edited *Ceramics in America* 2017 issue, and co-authored "English Delft for Colonial Tavern Tables in King William County and Williamsburg, Virginia," in *Ceramics in America* 2023 issue. She serves on the Board of the American Ceramic Circle.
